Topics include the rise of managed care; changes in payment systems; the growth of medical specialization and sub-specialization; advances in biomedical and pharmaceutical research; efforts at comprehensive and partial health reform; changes in various foreign delivery systems; the expansion of the uninsured and under-insured class; the amalgamation of community hospitals into delivery networks; the expansion of multi-specialty practice groups; and the increasing profitability of pharmaceutical and medical device companies.
